Dear Speaker Pelosi, Leader McConnell, Leader McCarthy, and Leader Schumer:

As cases of COVID-19 continue to increase across the country, the Modern Medical Alliance is keenly focused on how the visu and its economic impacts are affecting hundreds of millions of Americans and states' Medical programs. The Modern Medical Alliance includes national and regional organizations that represent pulsets, consumen, health care worker, Middern, older adults, people with disabilities, pregnant and postpartum women, and health insurance providers. Together, we ask Congress with the greatest urgency to strengthen America's Medical program in pending COVID-19 relial regisation during the final weeks of the 10th

We specifically call on Congress to enhance federal financing for Medicaid by increasing states' Federal Medical Assistance Percentage (FMAP) to a total of at least 12 percentage points, consistent with the request made by the bipartisan National Governors Association. In addition, we urge Congress to include dedicated funds for Medicaid home and communitybased services (FMSS).

Medicald is the largest health care program in the country, covering about 1 in 5 Americans, including millions of children, older adults, people with disabilities, and nearly 2 million veterans. Over the past 50 years, Medicalid has played a critical role in helping Americans when they need it most and has acted as a safety net for vulnerable populations to receive high-

The number of Americans who rely on Medicaid has grown dramatically during the COVID-19 crisis. From February to July 2020, Medicaid enrollment has increased by more than 4.3 million

- <u>July</u> and <u>November</u> sign-on letters garnered signatures from 39 and 40 partners, respectively
- Urged Congress to increase states' federal match (FMAP) and provide designated funding for HCBS
- Promoted among Hill, press, and Beltway audiences

Strengthening Medicaid Amid

It is critical that policymokers prioritize strengthening America's Medicaid program in pending COVID-19 relief legislation.


 $Increased \ Enrollment \ During \ COVID-19 - The number of Americans \ who rely on \ Medicaid has grown \ dramatically during the COVID-19 crisis.$

- From February to June 2020. Medicaid enrollment increased by more than 3.4 million people or 4.8% nationwide.
- . The fastest enrollment growth has occurred among non-elderly, non-disabled adults.
- States expect Medicaid enrollment and spending to increase by more than 856 in fiscal year 2021.
- At the same time, state revenues are dropping significantly, and overall state budget shortfalls are projected to reach \$555 billion through 2022.

Consequences of Inaction - Without increased funding for Medicaid, hardworking Americans could be denied access to the essential core they need and deserve. This is specially true for some of the hardest his community members like frontine workers, those with substance use disorders and behavioral health concerns, and communities of color. Emrollees stand to force glossutating consequences, such as:

- . Threatening children's access to care, due to lower payments to children's hospitals and pediatric providers.
- Fewer older adults able to stay in their homes and communities, as programs reduce or eliminate home and community-based services and supports.
- Decreased access to mental health and substance use disorder treatment, at the same time that opioid overdoses skyrocket across the country, due to gust so program funding. Medicaid is the largest payer for mental health care, and one-third of those in the expansion population have mental health and substance use disorder needs.
- Longer waitlists for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities, as crucial home and community-based services may be eliminated.





Updated Medicaid Dashboard

- Updated in September, the Medicaid Dashboard provides the latest national and state level enrollment and polling information
- Essential resource for federal and state leaders looking for up-to-date information, including state-specific reports for all 50 states plus DC
- Updated with COVID-19 data this month

Suggested Dashboard Uses

Advocacy organizations are using the Medicaid Dashboard to pull national and state-specific data about Medicaid for several uses. Below are some <u>tips for leveraging the Dashboard</u> data in your daily work:

- Demonstrate the overwhelming support for Medicaid through advocacy tools and educational resources.
- Advocate for specific policy changes by sharing with state chapters to compare their Medicaid programs to neighboring states.
- Identify potential new partners based on population-specific data (e.g., children, people with disabilities, older adults) provided by the Dashboard.



Digital Media Update

MMA Digital Update

- Starting in April, we took a more proactive stance around our actions on federal Medicaid issues on social media
- Promoted new resources with paid media in the Beltway to aid advocacy objectives:
 - Testimonials
 - One-pagers
 - Infographics
 - Press releases
 - Statements
- Engagement increased more than 200% year over year
- People clicked to learn more over 66,800 times
- We saw an increase in web traffic year over year of more than 700%





Social Media Learnings from 2020

- Show your expertise: audiences enjoyed viewing partner expertise in our video-based content and infographics
- Keep it simple: audiences were more likely to engage with social posts that featured messages that were short, sweet, and to the point
- Use COVID-19 appropriate visuals: audiences were more likely to positively engage when posts used images that were sensitive to the COVID-19 crisis
- Prioritize using original graphics: audiences were more likely to engage with posts that were original images
